CONDITIONS OF COMPETITION

1. HANDICAPS AND GRADES

GRADE CUT-OFFS will be determined on GA Handicaps. Results will not be sent to Golfink until Sunday evening so all players' GA handicaps will remain constant throughout the tournament. However, players' Daily Handicaps may change as a result of the different slope ratings of the courses played on each day.

PROVISIONAL GRADES: To be amended or confirmed 8 June 2018

A GRADE: GA HANDICAP + 2 to 8.7 incl

B GRADE: GA HANDICAP: 8.8 to 15.2_ incl

C GRADE: GA HANDICAP: 15.3 to 36 incl

COURSES

The field will be split into two groups.

GROUP 1 on Saturday 9 June will play **Brush Box Blue (Holes 19 – 27 then 1 – 9)**.

GROUP 2 on Saturday 9 June will play **Gymea Lily Blue (Holes 1 – 18)**.

The courses will be reversed on Sunday 10 June

Tee times on both days will be 6.43 – 7.26, and 9.54 – 11.42.

All play will be off the **BLUE MARKERS**.

NB. A coffee machine is available in the hallway outside the pro shop, but the Blue Water Grill will not be open until 10.00 am when the clubhouse itself opens.

3. PRIZES

There will be DAILY and OVERALL individual prizes in all grades.

Excluding NTPs, there will be a limit of **ONE PRIZE PER PLAYER**. Overall Prizes will be awarded first, and the daily prize winners will be adjusted accordingly.

Scoring for the **BOC TROPHY** will be coordinated by Tournament Director Ross Skinner.

5. SCORING

This is a **Stableford** competition. Scores are processed through the Micropower system. On the score cards provided you are required to place a X for the player's stroke taken on each hole. If you make a mistake you should fill in the mistaken box completely then place the X in the correct box. On the other section of the card you should record the player's and marker's strokes and Stableford points for each hole. At the end of the round, record the total Stableford points in the "Nett" box on the card.

In the Daily competitions a standard count-back will be used. However, if there is a tie on the overall championship, the countback will be held on each player's scores on holes 1 – 9 on Sunday, regardless of the order in which it was played.

6. RETURNING YOUR CARD

Please return your card to the Match Desk area upstairs in the clubhouse. We will have members to assist you with the scanning process so we won't detail the instructions here. However, **IT IS EACH PLAYER'S RESPONSIBILITY** to ensure that the **score recorded in the system is identical to the score that is written on their card**. **DO NOT PRESS "SAVE SCORE" UNTIL THE SCORE IS CORRECT.** If there is a discrepancy, the member volunteers will assist you in detecting and correcting the error.

7. PRESENTATIONS

Presentations will be held in the Function room as soon as the final results have been processed. Please note that because of the "One Prize per Player" rule mentioned above, it does take a little time to allocate the prizes. However we will have a team available to carry out this task as quickly as possible as soon as all Sunday scores are returned. It would be appreciated if the last groups of the day **return their cards immediately** after they finish their round before doing anything else. The Pro Shop will remain open afterwards if any prize winners wish to exchange their prizes.

TEMPORARY LOCAL RULES

To be read in conjunction with the LOCAL RULES as printed on the back of score cards.

Storm damaged bunkers to be treated as GUR. Ball to be dropped in bunker.

There are **PREFERRED LIES** for this tournament. The ball may be marked, lifted, cleaned and placed within 30 cm of the ball's original position, **ONLY IF THE BALL IS ON THE FAIRWAY OR AREAS SUCH AS GREEN SURROUNDS THAT ARE CUT TO FAIRWAY HEIGHT OR LESS.**

In response to the weather conditions it may be necessary for the Tournament Committee to put restrictions on cart traffic (eg carts in the rough only). Any such Conditions will be communicated on the day by the Pro shop.

There is a **temporary green on the 6th hole**. The distance is **40 m shorter** than to the actual hole.

Kangaroo and wallaby prints in bunkers may be treated as GUR. Ball must be dropped in bunker.

Kangaroo and Wallaby prints on greens may be repaired, even if on the line of putt.

Bare patches on the **fairways and greens** and areas such as green surrounds that are cut to fairway height or less, may be treated as GUR. This does not include divots or sand-filled divots.

If a ball hits a cart sign, the player has the option of replaying the shot.

Players are entitled to relief from tyre tracks **ON FAIRWAYS ONLY**. Only for the lie of the ball, not for stance. Take nearest point of relief, no nearer to the hole.

Players will be allowed relief (without penalty) when a ball resting on or near a tree root on the fairway (closely mown portion) is likely to impact on the player's safety at the moment of impact, or on the opportunity to effectively play a stroke. This rule does not extend to tree roots impacting on a player's stance. A ball coming to rest in a kangaroo digging on the closely mown portion of the fairway or areas such as green surrounds that are cut to fairway height or less may be treated as GUR. However relief may not be taken for interference to stance.

NELSON BAY GOLF CLUB - LOCAL RULES

To be read in conjunction with the Rules of Golf.

See also the **TEMPORARY LOCAL RULES BOARD**

1. Lateral hazard posts are immovable obstructions.
2. All trees marked by stakes and/or plastic guards that interfere with the player's stance or swing are immovable obstructions. Players may take relief provided in Rule 24-2b (i)
3. Balls striking power lines and/or power poles MUST be replayed without penalty.
4. Out of bounds is defined by white pegs with black tops, or black and white painted squares.
5. Cart directional signs are movable obstructions. and advertising signs are immovable obstructions. Players may take relief provided in Rule 24-2b(i)
6. All stakes, pegs, ropes and hoops, <u>except those defining out of bounds and lateral hazards</u> are movable obstructions. Proceed under Rule 24-1. Permanently installed posts and ropes are immovable obstructions.
7. Embedded Ball - "Through The Green" - Any ball embedded in its own pitch-mark in ground, other than sand may be lifted, cleaned and dropped as near as possible to where it originally lay, no nearer the hole, without penalty.
8. Optional drop zone near the 18 th green pond. This MAY be used for relief from the lateral water hazard under penalty of one stroke.
9. All artificially surfaced roads and paths are to be considered as immovable obstructions.
10. All motorised carts and bikes MUST not be driven within 30 metres of greens and MUST follow cart signs to use paths where directed.
11. Machinery sheds and surroundings designated by rope and/or white posts are to be treated as GUR.
12. Fixed sprinkler heads. If ball lies within two club lengths of such an obstruction in the line of play and within two club lengths of the green, the player may obtain relief without penalty as follows: The ball may be marked, lifted, cleaned and dropped at the nearest point of relief, not nearer the hole.
13. A Player may obtain distance information by use of a distance measuring device. If, during a stipulated round, a player uses a distance measuring device to gauge or measure other conditions that might affect his play (eg elevation changes, wind speed etc) the player is in breach of rule 14.3
14. ACCIDENTAL MOVEMENT OF A BALL ON THE PUTTING GREEN a. Rules 18-2, 18-3 and 20-1 are modified as follows: b. When a player's ball lies on the putting green, there is no penalty if the ball or ball-marker is accidentally moved by the player, his partner, his opponent, or any of their caddies or equipment. c. The moved ball or ball-marker must be replaced as provided in Rules 18-2, 18-3 and 20-1. d. This Local Rule applies only when the player's ball or ball-marker lies on the putting green and any movement is accidental. e. Note: If it is determined that a player's ball on the putting green was moved as a result of wind, water or some other natural cause such as the effects of gravity, the ball must be played as it lies from its new location. A ball-marker moved in such circumstances is replaced.
15. All woodchip areas and gardens are an integral part of the course.
<u>Warning</u> 1. It is a condition of entry to this course that you acknowledge that you do not rely on the Club to ensure your safety from lightning. 2. Many species of wild life that inhabit this course can be dangerous. Do not approach, touch or feed any wildlife. 3. Any damage caused to a NBGC golf cart must be paid for at the set rates.
